

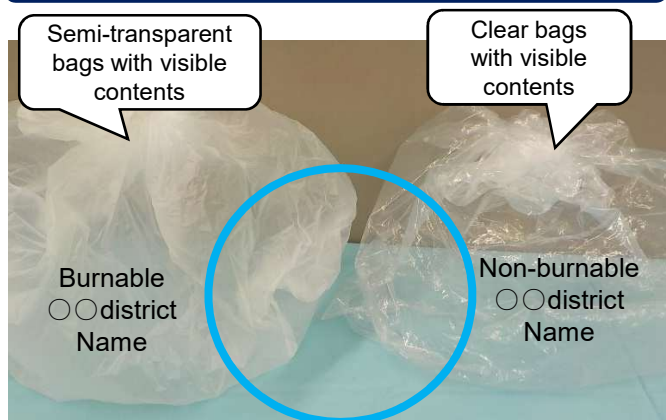
When it is difficult to get designated trash bags

About the Extension of Temporary Measures for Iwata City's Designated Garbage Bags

Due to the recent situation in the Middle East, purchases of designated garbage bags have surged, and as a result, some stores are experiencing shortages of these bags. Therefore, as a temporary measure, the period during which garbage may be disposed of using bags other than the designated garbage bags will be extended.

- In principle, please use the designated garbage bags.
- If you are unable to obtain designated garbage bags, please dispose of waste using the following methods.
- Period: May 15 (Fri) – **October 31 (Saturday)**
- Applicable waste types: Burnable waste, plastics, metals and small electrical appliances, hazardous waste, and landfill waste

○ Accepted garbage bags at collection sites



○ Please write the following three items on the bag: “Burnable” or “Non-burnable”, your district name and your name.

○ Use plastic or vinyl bags

○ Use transparent or semi-transparent bags with visible contents

○ Bag sizes: Burnable wastes: 6ℓ to 45ℓ

Non-burnable wastes: 6ℓ to 30ℓ

※ 45ℓ reference : Extra-large burnable garbage bag

※ 30ℓ reference : Large non-burnable garbage bag

※ 6ℓ reference : Small-size burnable and non-burnable garbage bag

(Approximately 55 cm in height × 30 cm in width)

○ Please tie the bags securely so the contents are sealed

× Non-accepted garbage bags at collection sites



× Bags with colors that do not allow the contents to be seen (Opaque bags)

× Bags from which garbage protrudes, and liquid may leak through (such as cardboard boxes or paper boxes)

× Bags that cannot be tied closed

× Garbage bags designated by other municipalities

× Business Waste Bags (Blue)

Designated garbage bags are manufactured by multiple companies, and supply is expected to be at a level comparable to previous years. We kindly ask residents to refrain from purchasing more than necessary. We would also like to take this opportunity to ask for your further cooperation in waste reduction efforts.
